## Superintendent's Message - June 2010

Dear Parents and  
Community Members,

The past couple of years have been marked by our challenge to do more with less. We have continued to provide the highest level of academic experiences to our students and we have done it in a harsh economic climate. However, now the paradigm has shifted - we have, and are continuing to "Excel in Tough Times...."

I would like to take this opportunity to reflect on a few of the challenges and some of the triumphs of the past year. We began the year knowing the economic crisis that has plagued our state, was going to get worse before it got better. In March we had to decrease our budget by another \$27 million dollars - laying off more teachers and classified employees, increasing class size further at every grade level, and eliminating even more services. The budgetary projections in the May Revision, though not worse, are definitely not better.

Nevertheless, the TUSD community - teachers, administrators, classified staff - continue to provide our students with the educational foundation and opportunities to become "Cool Kids" (abc7 news),

congressional art winners, and academic decathlon champions. This month, high school seniors will wear their caps and gowns, they will throw up their hats in exuberance, and they will begin a new chapter in their educational careers. These students will head to schools like USC and UCLA, they will walk the halls of Ivy League campuses, and some will choose a vocation. Whatever path they travel down, each graduating student will take with them the advantage of a TUSD education, the foundation to succeed.

Every year, over 24,000 students are educated in our District. These students are ethnically diverse, speak different languages, and learn in different ways. Our goal for them, however, is the same - to educate them and prepare them to be a successful part of the global society.

**2010 Scholarship Recipients**

The Calle Mayor Scholarship Committee was faced with making a decision on just two recipients, out of a group of twenty-nine well-qualified applicants. They eventually decided on awarding a \$600 scholarship to two South High graduates, both former Calle bulldogs.

The first recipient, **Michael O'Brien** plans to attend the University of Michigan. His goal is to pursue a career in finance and accounting. Michael ranks 4<sup>th</sup> in his class, has an impressive WGPA of 4.62, is an AP Scholar with distinction, works part time, and has logged over 300+ community service hours through Boy Scouting and

his church. He loves to read and has taken responsibility for his own education by researching on his own. What he learns in class simply complements his pre-existing wealth of knowledge. His teachers say he has a great sense of humor, which, "...he is able to call upon at the appropriate moment to ease the tension to difficult situations and will wow you with his ability to break out into spontaneous dance!"

These students represent the next generation. With all the negative things we hear in the news about "kids today" it is refreshing to know that our society will be blessed with these two talented individuals.
